HUMANITARIAN EMERGENCY AND RELIEF

WATER SANITATION AND HYGIENE

The project was aimed at improving public health & sanitation through improved Hygiene activities

Elite Relief Somalia (ERS) in partnership with well-wishers diaspora provided sanitation and hygiene promotion services in Deyniile / Garasbaley in Mogadishu, Somalia. The inputs provided to the targeted beneficiaries for the activities include Brushes, Bio clean Soaps, Wheelbarrows, Rakes & many more.

The 8 months project was aimed at improving public health & sanitation through improved Hygiene activities. During the project, ERS supported the beneficiaries in the cleanup exercise, distribution of inputs and detergents.

The objective of the project was to prevent sanitation-related infectious diseases are associated with poor hygiene such as diarrhoea, cholera, dysentery, Parasite-borne diseases (ascarid, hookworm, trichocephalus, pinworm), Mosquito-borne diseases (malaria, petechial fever), Eye-related diseases (trachoma, red eyes), skin diseases (scabies, ringworm, fungous skin),gynecological diseases (infectious reproductive system, etc.)



WATER SANITATION AND HYGIENE

10 water points improved & 60 water user Committee members were trained to maintain the water systems

In partnership with Well-Wishers Diaspora, ERS also implemented activities to improve access to safe water in a project targeting various beneficiaries drawn from Deyniile / Garasbaley in Mogadishu, Somalia. The project was aimed at empowering the community to plan environmental improvements, and to encourage proper management of water and sanitation facilities in the area.

ERS used various communication channels to disseminate hygiene and sanitation which are essential in the prevention of water and sanitation-related diseases. A total of 10 water points were improved and 60 Water User Committee members and caretakers from the local community trained to operate, and maintain these water systems. This will help to ensure that the water systems are serviceable every time and regularly thereafter.

ERS also has made significant strides in improving latrine coverage at the household level.



QUALITY HEALTHCARE SERVICE



The intervention has improved the well-being of beneficiaries (infants, young children and pregnant mothers)

With the support of well wishes diaspora, ERS provided reproductive health care in the Tawakal MCH to vulnerable IDPS and local communities in Mogadishu, Somalia. The organization supported mothers and children by carried out free ANC, PNC, vaccination, vitamins, hygiene kits, and micronutrients.

Apart from Reproductive Health Care and Maternal and child health care services, ERS through our maternal and child healthcare (MCH) Centre also provided other Primary healthcare services such as: Treatment of communicable and non-communicable diseases

The intervention has greatly Improved the well-being of beneficiaries (infants, young children and those who care for them, pregnant women) by taking into consideration past life experiences and past and present sufferings, as well as emerging needs;.

PROVISION OF FOOD AND NON FOOD ITEMS ASSISTANCE

The project was aimed at enabling the affected IDPs; access basic needs and meet their personal needs

ERS through partnership with Well-wishers diaspora delivered emergency food ration to 100 families of IDPS affected by food insecurity at Deyniile / Garasbaley in Mogadishu. Also distributed are non-food items as part of our first line emergency response In order to improve the living conditions of vulnerable displaced populations living in IDP hosting sites

During the Programme, we worked in close collaboration with the affected communities and government authorities, prioritizing protection and the needs of the most vulnerable, and promoting meaningful, community-led engagement. Each family received 15kg of rice, 15kg of wheat flour, 15kg sugar, 3 litres of Oil as well as non-food items such as clothing, blankets and other bedding materials essential in ensuring safety security, health, dignity and wellbeing of people affected by displacement.

The aim of the project is to enable the affected IDPs access basic human needs and meet personal needs as they prepare to return to their original homes.



NUTRITION AND SUSTENANCE

The objective of the interventions was to protect infants and children, by optimizing care and nurturing mothers

In partnership with well-wishers diaspora, ERS offered nutrition services to affected IDPs and local communities at Deyniile / Garasbaley in Mogadishu, Somalia. ERS used internationally recognized community-based peer education platform (a community-based management of acute malnutrition) to build community capacity to address undernutrition and other key causes of mortality among children under five years. The model uses a multiplier effect at the village level by engaging men and women in the dissemination of key health and nutrition messages. This is achieved by preventing an increase in acute malnutrition, morbidity and mortality rates, by showing the vulnerable families how to support the infant's development and increase its chances of survival by offering counsel against the negative impact of distribution of free breast-milk substitute samples; and providing appropriate and sustainable solutions in cases where maternal feeding is not an option.

The objective of the interventions was to protect infants and children within the family unit in an emergency situation, by optimizing care and nurturing the mother and family psychosocial resources.

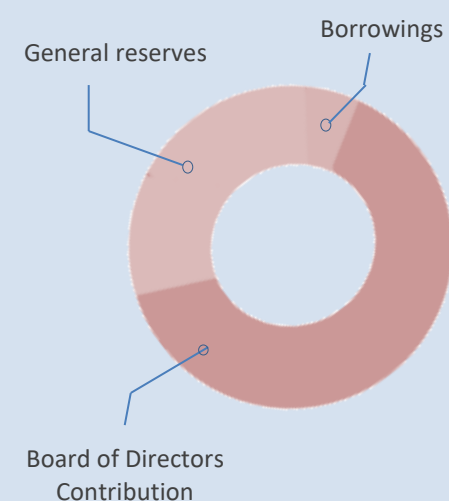
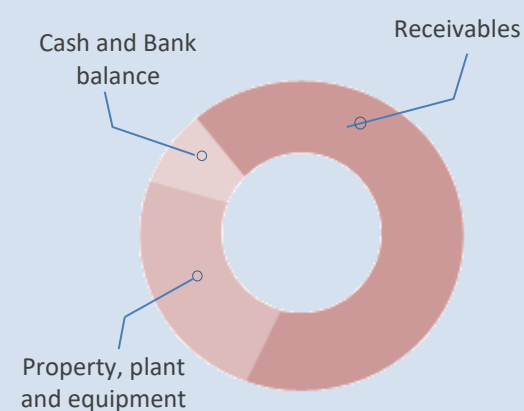
